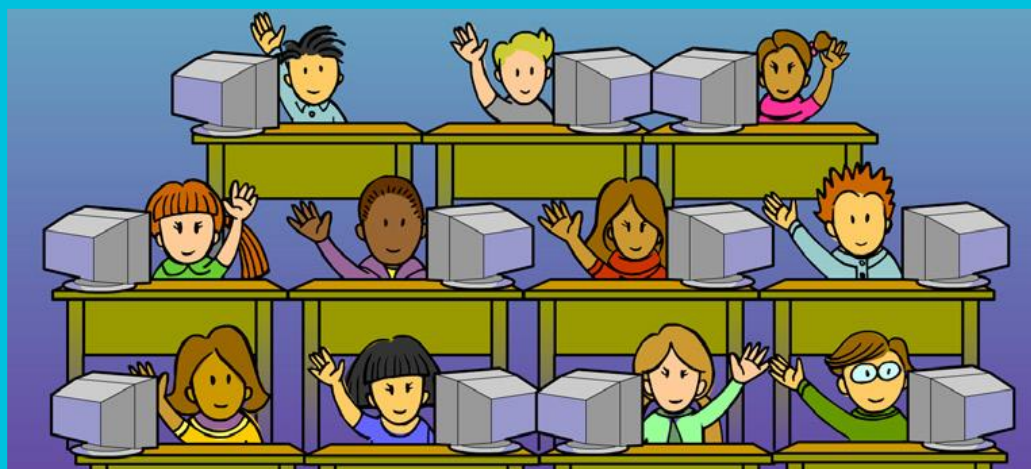
What do we know about plagiarism?

<p>Immersion</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask students if they have ever experienced someone copying them, like repeating what they say or mimicking what they do or write. Identify that most people find this frustrating and upsetting. Explain that, when you are researching information for projects, or want to share something you think is cool online, it's not only annoying for the person whose work is being copied, it's actually against the law. Show and read the Copyright and Plagiarism poster with class. 	<p>Locate information through search engines and in documents by using search terms provided.</p>	<p>Locate information through search engines and in documents by applying search terms, and select relevant information.</p> <p>Activity</p> <p>F-2 (whole class focus):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> As a whole class, model filling out a QAR chart for each of these questions: What is plagiarism? Why should I care about plagiarism? How do I avoid plagiarism? This resource is helpful to use as your research. Don't forget to model recording the source of your information. <p>3-4:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Break into pairs. Plagiarism (say: PLAY-juh-rih-zem)

Plagiarism is when you use someone else's words or ideas and pass them off as your own. It's not allowed in school, college, or beyond, so it's a good idea to learn the proper way to use resources, such as websites.

Copyright is a form of protection given to the authors or creators of "original works of authorship", including literary, dramatic, musical, artistic and other intellectual works.
