Communicating and collaborating

What could happen?



Australian Curriculum Alignment

Level 1

Collaborate and safely share information with known peers and trusted adults using simple tools.

Level 2

Collaborate and safely exchange information with known peers and trusted adults using familiar tools, taking different opinions and views into consideration.

Level 3

Collaborate and safely exchange information with trusted audiences using a range of tools to explore a different point of view.

Immersion

- Remind students that when they share something online, it can be hard to keep track of who sees it. Because of that, it's helpful to stop and think before you share things!

Activity

F-4 (whole class):

- Sit in a circle.
- Begin by reading aloud one of the scenarios on the 'communal story' chart.
- Move around the circle, with one student contributing what could happen next in the story. When you have reached an end, the next student can choose another scenario from the chart.
- Write a brief summary of each story on the board as you proceed.

Share and discuss

- Read through the 'before you share, ask yourself...' poster.
- Ask students to reflect: If they had thought of these things, how may have the stories that you all came up with be different?
- F-2: Record some of these modifications on the board, next to the original story.
- 3-4: Ask students to individually write a modified version of one of the stories.
